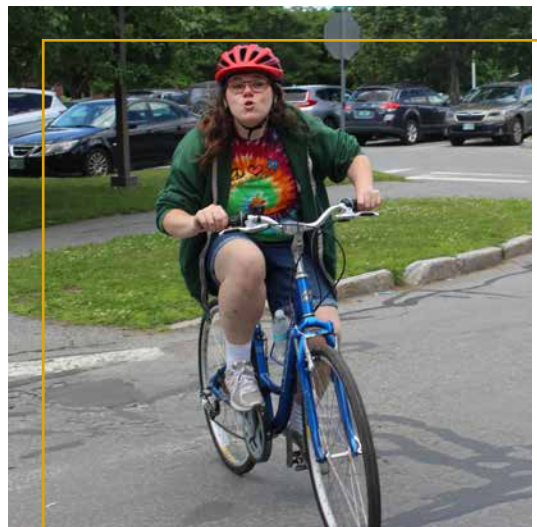

## Hello Supporters of Zack's Place,

As 2021 is now closed, we reflect on a challenging but wonderful year of enriching our participants and community. In May of 2021, we returned to in-person curriculums, and we were back to our quality programs offered to the special needs community at no cost. The isolation during COVID quarantining was devastating, as you well know by now, and the impact on the special needs community is even more isolating. Despite the challenges, and thanks to our community; Zack's Place achieved another year of fulfilling our mission.

Today our participant enrollment is at an all-time high of 100, varying in ages ranging from 7 to 60 years old. Zack's Place participants have a diverse range of special needs resulting from physical, cognitive, and developmental challenges such as cerebral palsy, autism, and down syndrome. Our constituents come from Woodstock and all over the Upper Valley, and routinely travel from distances of up to 40 miles.

In addition to serving special needs individuals, we serve as a learning center for mainstream students, administrators, teachers, and community members. Our community volunteers join us as instructors or volunteers and as partners in special events. Some of our programs see senior citizens or high school students joining in the dancing, singing or exercises classes. These are all community members who might never know or be touched by the abilities and talents of our ZP population. Zack's Place is blessed to now have over 400 volunteers that serve in one capacity or another over the course of each year.

A major milestone achieved in 2021, was the performance of our musical, Beauty and The Beazt. The entire process of the making of Beauty and The Beazt was made into a documentary film with Jim Sadwith, a local but well-known producer. The documentary, which included the back stories of some of our participant actors and their families, will be shown at Indie film festivals in the next year. We are thrilled to be spreading the word of our wonderful enrichment center at a national scale. Another significant achievement was the purchase of our own accessibility equipped ten-person van allowing us to readily transport participants on field trips. Zack's Place no longer must rely on costly third-party rentals, limitations in availability, or non-accessibility equipped vehicles.

Our center continues to thrive with many beautiful updates to our building, a dedicated and professional staff, professional instructors, strong board, successful fundraisers, and community support. We could not be more proud and thankful of our participants and our community; thank you for another successful year.

# FINANCIAL

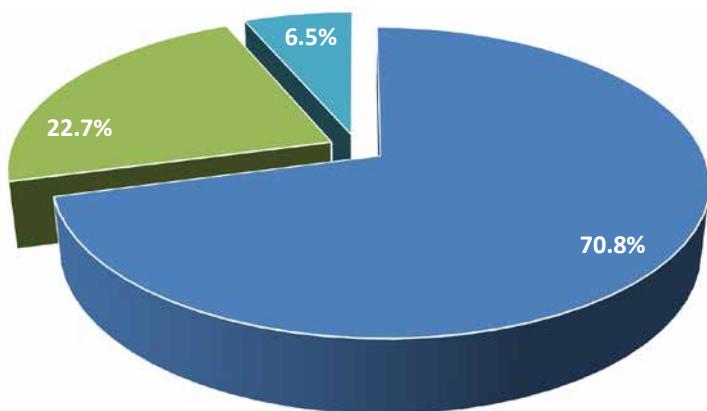

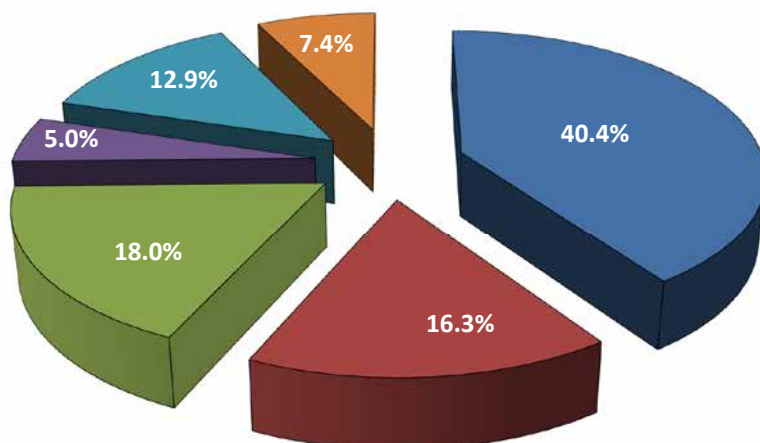

# SUSTAINABILITY

Not-for-profit service organizations rely heavily on the generosity of donors for their operating funds. At Zack's Place, grants, fundraising events, and donations are our sole source of those funds. All our programming is free with no questions asked and we receive no government funding whatsoever.

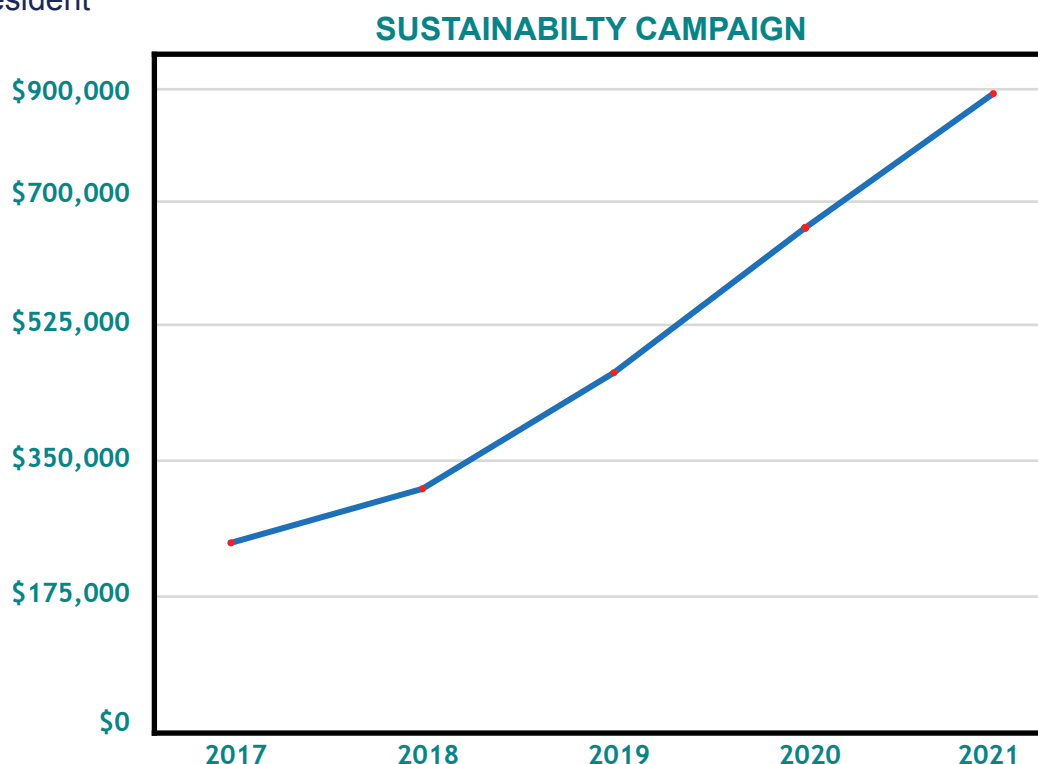
Six years ago, the board determined that to insure the financial stability of our organization, we should establish an endowment type fund and soon thereafter launched that effort. We call our fund the "Sustainability Fund". Monies added to that fund are restricted to certain categories of uses and require a formal process for their withdrawal.

We are truly thrilled to note that our Sustainability Fund has now reached the \$875,000 mark. These funds are invested conservatively as one would expect from a Board acting in a fiduciary capacity for a not-for-profit. In spite of our conservative approach, this fund continues to appreciate and with monies added by donors from time to time, the Board feels that the future of Zack's Place is well protected.

The fundraising successes of Zack's Place speak to the quality and quantity of our daily full time programming. Our donors recognize the overwhelming need for our enrichment center, but also how profoundly its daily programs improve the lives of those who partake of those programs. Zack's Place is truly unique in that we serve people of all ages and with varying levels of abilities. Many of our participants have multiple developmental or mental health challenges. Each of them finds one or several programs or field trips that they love and which speaks best to their talents and strengths. They gain friendships along the way and their caretakers find respite to recharge their own batteries.

We, the Board, thank each and every one of our wonderful supporters for their financial contributions but also wish to thank the wonderful volunteers who help keep our fundraising efforts so successful.

Through its integration of ZP participants, local musicians, artists and community members, the musical has developed into a much-anticipated town-wide event each year.

The musical, which began as a small production attended by participants and family members, has grown in size and appreciation and is now played to the 400 seat Woodstock Town Hall theater. The musical stretches the talents of the participants and enables them to perform at levels their parents and caretakers often say they never imagined. I have had the privilege of writing and directing three of these musicals and each time, I have thought, 'What a great film this would make!' The laughter and tears, the successes and the setbacks - just like any professional production (stage or film) -- give the participants life experiences that only a small part of the general population get to enjoy.

A unique aspect of Zack's Place is its presence right in the center of town. Participants mingle and work alongside community members from every walk of life. This carries forward to the musical as it brings them together in a more intimate way. Elementary and high school students, teachers, business owners, state legislators, merchants, craftsmen, police chief, selectmen, and our very own retired NBC news anchor, Bob Hager, paint sets and props; rehearse; sing; dance; and learn lines, side by side. In addition, local artists and musicians contribute their talents to every production. This musical event is a true partnership among stakeholders increasing community engagement in a progressive action while incorporating the arts at the same time.

Zack's Place provides a safe, stable and enriching environment for participants, parents and caregivers that is not available elsewhere -- and at no cost. The Enrichment Center is a place where the community comes together to engage in creative projects that improve the livability and appeal of the Woodstock area community by strengthening our community's identity. The most important outcome, however, has been the growing understanding that all people have value."



# ZP MUSICAL

## BEAUTY AND THE BEAZT

The big day had arrived at Town Hall Theater: Cast members were getting into costumes, stagehands were going over last-minute changes, stage, sound and lighting crews were fine tuning lights and music for the much – anticipated Zack’s Place musical, *Beauty and the Beazt*. The energy was palpable along with last minute jitters that everyone experiences before the “big show”.

Zack’s Place participants, community members, and staff had been rehearsing tirelessly twice a week since early fall under the professional and gentle guidance of our gifted scriptwriter and director, Jim Sadwith, who wanted to chronicle, on film, the process of bringing our musical to the stage. Included in the documentary would also be daily programming at Zack’s Place as well as background on our participants, their families, community members, and our Board. The film crew documented our weekly rehearsals at the Little Theater one week a month from September through December. Participants developed a welcoming and warm relationship with film crew members. As our director, Jim helped us take on a diverse set of roles from a beast and his love interest, Search and Rescue Team members, to Persons of Small Stature, animals, trees, an assistant police chief, princes, and princesses. Dance steps were perfected and lines were memorized. Behind the scenes, volunteers designed and built the sets and props to bring the audience into a magical Black Forest and castle. Our Executive Director, Dail Frates, Assistant Director, Holly O’Brien, and Program Directors, Kitty King, Sarah Roberts, and Doug Phillips were there to keep everyone on time for rehearsals and focused on the goal of bringing our play to the community.

Amongst our cast members were seasoned veterans of Zack’s Place musicals, along with several who had not experienced the magic that happens as rehearsals play out and the production comes to life for one-night only on the Town Hall stage. Witnessing the way participants worked together to assist those new to the process was heartwarming. When a cast member experienced the loss of a beloved pet, participants offered kind words and hugs, as well as the space needed to express feelings. When actors experienced frustration with learning lines, participants stepped up to offer hints and support. When our director, Jim Sadwith, suffered serious injuries due to a fall, the Zack’s Place participants and staff worked together until Jim was able to rejoin us to bring the musical to the stage, ever mindful that “the show must go on.” Watching the precision of volunteer stage hands move sets around and take on roles that were new to them with humor and energy were all part of the teamwork exhibited by everyone involved with the musical. Working with the professionals at Town Hall Theater who were instrumental in assisting us with optimizing space, lighting, and sound that spotlighted the acting skills of our cast was amazing.

We are deeply grateful to all those who supported our play and were involved in a myriad of ways. A huge thank you to Jim and Nerissa Sadwith, whose vision to tell the story and dedication to the participants persevered through so much to bring this musical to our community. We stand in awe of how Zack’s Place participants, their families and caregivers gave so much to bring this splendid musical evening to life. # OUR NEW VAN

## THE VALUE OF WHEELS

So, you may ask, what does wheels have to do with Zack's Place? Well of course, there are wheel chairs but I am talking about something quite different. This past fall, Zack's Place acquired its very own tenpassenger, accessible van and wow, what a difference it makes.

In the past, any foray or field trip of some distance required that we rent a bus; a school bus to be exact. With that came the need to schedule our trips around the time frame when the buses would not be needed to transport the school children. In addition, if we were to stay at a venue for a couple of hours, we had to pay for that "down" time regardless of whether the bus was needed elsewhere or not.

Then Covid hit. When we were finally able to reconvene in person, we discovered that the school buses became unreliable due to driver shortages. That clinched it; we heard of a wonderful auction deal on a fully accessible, Ford E250 van that had all the equipment to handle ten passengers and had been outfitted to carry up to two wheelchairs. We made the purchase and have never looked back.

Scheduling, dependability and flexibility in inclement weather are no longer issues. If it storms and we cannot go to Silver Lake for kayaking or canoeing, we can go to a movie theater or to bowl. How liberating and wonderful for our participants who would much rather be out and about than sitting indoors all day.

Thanks to all of our ever generous donors, we were able to make this purchase when the opportunity arose using our Sustainability/Endowment Fund. No worries about where we might glean the funds from or what programs might need to be scaled back. Zack's Place is truly blessed with Miracles for which we are always grateful.

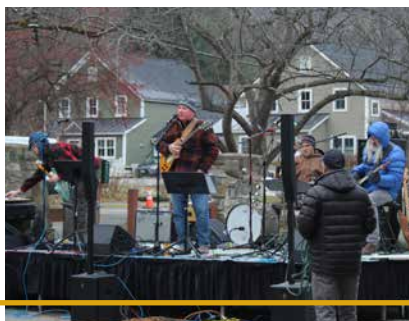
# FUNDRAISING
